Park Avenue is a group of council houses that were built around 1920. The 1939 register shows that all the properties were occupied at that time. Subsequently the houses were sold, and are now privately owned.



No 1 Park Avenue



In 1912 Ellis Williams, a brewer, died at Stafford House on Church Street, leaving his widow Elizabeth and daughter Phoebe Amelia. A second daughter, Sarah Elizabeth (Sally) had recently married Robert Griffith Bentley, and was living in Bristol. Elizabeth and Phoebe had moved into No 1 Park Avenue by 1928, because on 13th October that year Sally died here. Elizabeth also died here in June 1930, and was buried with Sally in the Fron cemetery. At the time of the 1939 Register only Phoebe was left living here. The house was now going under the name Inglecote. Phoebe gave her occupation as Boarding House Keeper, so was presumably renting out rooms. On 6th May 1947 Phoebe died, and was buried at Llantysilio.

By 1948 the occupants were Walter Price Pugh, a sawyer at Cowards Timber Yard, and his family. Wife Gwladys, son Raymond Walter, and daughters, Mary Emily, Gertrude Margaret and Harriet. Walter retired in 1964, but by then the family the children had married and they had moved to 16 Coedafon, and Arthur Stanley Hughes, who had just married Uveda Jones, moved here from 16 Coedafon. Arthur was an assistant baker. Arthur died here on 13th July 1993, and Uveda on 21st December 20022. They are buried at Llantysilio Churchyard.

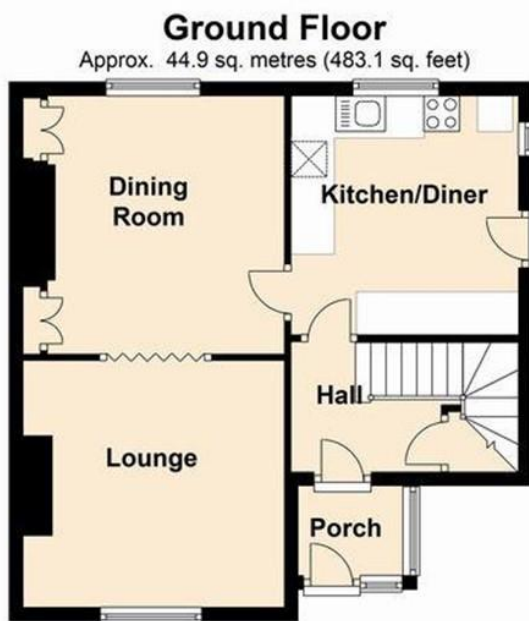

Robert Williams, a plasterer, was recorded as being here in 1920. He had previously lived at 6 Cross Lane. Robert's wife was Winifred, and they had three sons, John W, David and Robert Wyn. They had two daughters, Mary Winifred and Sybil. Winifred died here in 1937, and Robert in 1951.

Their youngest son, Robert Wyn Williams ran away to Wrexham in 1914 to

join up. His mother told the authorities that he was only 16, and he was sent home. He ran away again, this time to Liverpool where he joined the South Lancashire Regiment. In 1939 he had joined the Royal Corps of Military Police, and was sent to France. He was capture, and escaped. But unfortunately he was recaptured and held until 1945.

THE LATE MISS SYBIL WILLIAMS.

After many years of suffering, Miss Sybil Williams of 3 Park Avenue, passed away at Trevalyn Hospital on Dec 26th at the age of 71. Miss Williams was very well-known in the town, having been for so many years assistant at Lodwick's Stores, but she suffered much ill-health after her- retirement and Has devotedly nursed by her elder sister, Miss Marie Williams who survives her, but is now also in hospital at Brynhyfryd, Welshpool, where she is near her sister-in-law Mrs M E Williams.

It was a very devoted family at No 3 Park Avenue, Miss Marie Williams having come from London where she worked for the Red Cross, to nurse her late mother –and later on her father. The sisters had the grief of losing their elder brother Mr R W Williams of Welshpool in 1956 and subsequently their younger brother Mr David Williams, who, after his retirement came from Holyhead to reside with them and was very popular in the town, giving noteworthy service as Secretary of the Cricket Club. It was in his grave that Miss Sybil Williams was laid to rest on Thursday lasts Dec 30th

The service in St John's Church was conducted by the Vicar, the Rev.J I Rees, with Mr. H Thomas at the organ. The family mourners were: Mrs M S Williams (sister-in-law); Mr Hugh Williams, Forden and Mr David Williams, Shrewsbury (nephews). Neighbours from Park Avenue were present and Miss Margaret Hughes, Wrexham, who visited Miss Williams regularly during the 42 years she was at Trevalyn, also attended.

No 5 Park Avenue



The earliest recorded occupants were Edward Thomas Davies and wife Alice. Thomas, Edward's father had been a waggoner, but later became the landlord of the Waterloo Inn, but on his death, James Edward's eldest brother took over. Edward worked at the inn as a Brewer/ Stoker. He was living in Waterloo Cottage in 1911. He later became a council roadman, and moved into No 5. In 1939 Edward's children Albert Edward and Sarah Olive were living here. Albert was a gardener. In 1953 Sarah married Griffith Arfon Jones who had worked with his father Thomas at Eirianalt Farm, but later worked at Monsanto. Albert died at the farm on 1st April 1955, and was also buried in the Fron Cemetery.

The earliest recorded occupant of No 7 was David Hughes, a miller, originally from Cerrig y Druidon. He had moved to Llangollen in the 1890's, initially to Abbey Square, and later to Minafon in Green Lane. He and his wife Ellen had 10 children. Ellen died in 1929, and in 1939 he was living here with one of his daughters, Ethel. Ethel was a graduate, and was shown in 1939 as having independent means. David died towards the end of 1943.

In 1939/1940, during the Second World War, factories near London were vulnerable to bombing, so the Ministry of Supply evacuated a munitions factory, Davies Brothers (Motor Supplies), from Hither Green to the now vacant Mile End Mill. The Manager was a Mr Alfred Ted Broadhurst. Immediately after the war it was producing farm equipment for companies like Jones Balers, accessories for Black and Decker and many other companies. On the retirement of Alfred Ted Broadbent in 1958 his son, also Alfred Ted Broadhurst took over, and bought out the Llangollen part of the business.



Cyril Percy Elliot, who had been a tool maker in London before the war, was an employee of Davies Brothers. Cyril, who had been born in London, 10th July 1915, had married Dorothy Jarrard in Lewisham in 1940. They moved to 8 Berwyn Street, Llangollen, where their Bryan Cyril was born 3rd September 1942. They then moved to No 7, around 1943, Cyril died in December 1944.

In 1939 Peter William Roberts and his family were living here. Peter was originally from Corwen, in October 1907 he had married Elizabeth Holland in Wrexham. In 1911 they were living in Broughton, and Peter was working as a mine labourer. By 1913 they had moved to 11 Hall Street, and Peter was now described as a coal carter. In 1917 they were living at No 2 Aber Adda Cottage. Peter and Elizabeth had eight children. In 1939 Peter was described as a roadman, and it is likely that five of their children were still living at home.

The Bailey Bridge



In the 1950's there was an attempt to reduce congestion for pedestrians to get to the Eisteddfod by providing parking for up to 2,000 cars near Mile End Mill, with access to the Maes via a temporary bridge from the end of Park Avenue to a point on Abbey Road near the Jenny Jones. Initially the bridge was provided by the army.

THE BAILEY BRIDGE

There has been' a lot of speculation about the bridge over the Dee to be built by Army



Engineers for the 1958 Eisteddfod, and last week the details were published.

Let us make it dear that it is army policy for their engineers' training exercises to be of some use to the community; that is, they have to, learn to build one for a useful purpose, if possible.

They have to learn to blow up obstacles and they like if possible to

detonate where- it may be required for public or private benefit.

Following negotiations with the War Office through Western Command the bridge will be constructed by 113 (Cheshire) Army Engineer: Regiment a Territorial Army Unit.

In the parking places opposite Mile End there will be room for 2,000 cars, whose occupants can use the bridge 140 feet long by 9 feet wide, built from a point, opposite the end of Park



Avenue across to where the railway arch provides access from Abbey Road to the river bank. In short, they will emerge just; opposite the Jenny Jones, It will certainly save much overcrowding of the Town Bridge., and people who park the cars on the Tower Road fields will be allowed to leave by going down Wharf Hill, which again will lessen congestion.

BRAVE RESCUE

Many Llangollen people remember Terry Fellows as the hero of Miss Hazel Swift's film of the International Eisteddfod which was shown here and at Rhos, National Eisteddfod last year.

Now Terry has become a hero in another sense.

On the Wednesday following this year's national Eisteddfod, about half past two, two daughters of Mr and Mrs Williams, of 9 Park Avenue, Carol aged 12 and Janet aged 2 went to play on the Pontoon Bridge erected between Park Avenue and Abbey Road to ease pedestrian traffic.

From the bridge itself it was easy to get into one of the pontoon boats, and while playing there, Janet fell headlong into the river's four to five foot of water. Carol called for help. Terry happened to be standing on the river bank and immediately plunged in. Terry is a good swimmer and he quickly brought Janet up from the river bottom, and took her home, no worse for her adventure which might have ended so tragically had he not been there, for her sister Carol is no swimmer and an attempt by her might have been unsuccessful. Terry's prompt action is naturally greatly appreciated by Janet's parents.

Commenting on the affair, Mr Williams expressed the opinion that the Bailey bridge built on the first occasion when the Army units helped the Eisteddfod in this way, was far safer than the Pontoon Bridge lately erected. The Pontoon bridge has only a hand rail, and without any wire netting or other protection, it is the easiest thing in the world for children to climb down into the boats, and obviously attractive adventure.

Mrs Williams comment was that all School children in Llangollen should be taught to swim and she regretted that organised visits to Wrexham Swimming baths had been discontinued.

THE LATE MISS GLADYS BAILEY

The death of Miss Gladys Bailey on Saturday evening, April 1st came as a great shock and



grief to her family and to her innumerable friends in the town. Miss Bailey was taken suddenly ill while at work on March 21st and was instantly taken home by Mr and Mrs Glynne Jones. She was removed to Llangollen Hospital and though it was realised she, was seriously ill, she seemed better, and was able to enjoy visits by her relatives the evening she died. Miss Bailey was highly, esteemed by her employers and by those she served, for her reliability, loyalty and friendliness. Children, especially will not forget her kindness. For many years Miss Bailey had been with Miss Lloyd, Lauriston, when she was in

business, and for the last 13 years she had been a valued member of the staff at Jonathan Davies's. Both their premises and those of Messrs Glynne Jones, Chemists, were closed during the afternoon of April 4th and the entire staff of both businesses attended the funeral.

The deepest sympathy is felt for Miss Kathleen Bailey and Mr Arthur Bailey in the loss of so beloved a companion from their home.

The funeral took place on Tuesday, April 4th at St John's Church and new cemetery; but the Vicar had already conducted a service the previous evening when the cortege arrived from the hospital.

Dr Thomas also conducted the service on Tuesday at 3 p m, and in this he was assisted by the Rev L. M. Daniel, Vicar of Banger-on- Dee. Mr Jocelyn Wilson was the organist.
